Field(s) of knowledge	Interdisciplinary fundamentals of business and technology
Learning objectives / Competencies	<p>Professional competencies:</p> <p>Students command the basic vocabulary for describing the interrelations of business and technology (focus on lexis) and can communicate in English on technical and business topics (focus on phraseology, fluent speech). They can employ grammar, for example the employment of tenses, for the most part free of errors (focus on grammar).</p> <p>Students can describe and critically discuss cultural differences and their significance for the working world (focus on interculturality). They can filter out the desired information from a relevant technical/business text (focus on reading comprehension). They can reliably handle and solve listening exercises with language variants and non-native accents with increasing success (development of listening comprehension) as well as initially formulate brief texts relevant to business and technology, for the most part free of errors (development of writing skills in English).</p> <p>Interdisciplinary competencies:</p> <p>Students are capable of solving assigned tasks/projects with partners or in groups and present the solutions (cooperation abilities). They learn to reflect critically on recent research or trends in business and technology and discuss and take on positions regarding their own fields of work as well as handle language tasks (through provided aids) with increasing independence.</p>
