

Not sure where the campus is?

It is located here: Ctra de Valldemossa, km 7.5, 07122, Palma.

How do you get from Palma to the UIB?

The cheapest way is by metro or bus.



Bus

The **number 19** runs between Palma and the UIB campus every 10 minutes during term time. Bus tickets can be cheaper if you purchase special passes or apply for the Tarjeta Ciudadana travelcard (we will explain how to apply for one later on).



Metro

Metro line 1 runs between Palma city centre and the university campus. It departs from Plaza de España station and the UIB is the last stop. The entire journey takes just 13 minutes and trains depart every 15 minutes in term time.



Car

Take the MA-1110 road heading towards Valldemossa. The UIB is at kilometre mark 7.5.



Bicycle

There is a bike lane alongside Carretera de Valldemossa that connects the city centre and the UIB campus.



On foot

Although the UIB campus is on the outskirts of the city, it can also be reached on foot via Secar de la Real.

I'd like to know a bit more about the university's spaces, location and services. Where can I get this information?

In addition to the information that is available on its web page, the **International Relations Office** organizes **welcome events** one week prior to the beginning of the course. In them you will be able to solve any doubts or queries you might have. Furthermore, the members of the **Erasmus Student Network (ESN)** will provide you with all the information you will need for a rapid integration on campus.



One of the reasons why I'm taking part in the international mobility programme is to improve my Spanish and/or Catalan. What if I don't have a high level of proficiency in the local language? Will all lecturers bear this in mind?

The UIB offers exchange students 60-hour language courses of both **Spanish** and **Catalan**. These are adapted to your level and will be integrated into your academic curriculum at the UIB. And not only that! You can also be awarded **ECTS credits** for these courses. The level of demand will depend on the degree you study at the UIB.



What extra-curricular activities does the UIB offer?

In addition, the <u>Cultural</u> <u>Activities Service (SAC)</u> organizes leisure activities, workshops, courses and a wide range of other opportunities which will help you broaden your horizons and have an experience that will go beyond the purely academic dimension.



I'm a vegetarian/a vegan/coeliac/ lactose intolerant. Do the cafés on campus cater for my dietary needs?

The UIB has **9 cafés** which offer excellent daily menus from which you'll be able to choose the one that best adapts to your taste. If you have an allergy or food intolerance, contact the café to let them know.



I want to take all my subjects in English. Will that pose a problem?

That will depend on the degree you want to study at the UIB, as **not all our studies offer the choice to take all their subjects in English**. For further information, check the programme of **each specific degree**.



I want to experience life offcampus and get to know the area I'll be living in. What's the best way to get informed?

The **SRI** and the **ESN** will show you around the campus and the city within the framework of our welcome events. This is the best way to integrate into your new academic life! Moreover, once you have settled in Palma, you'll benefit from the advice and help granted by entities like **Palmajove**, which will help you solve any queries you might have.
